

GETTING AROUND ISTANBUL



ACCOMODATION


Istanbul is the most popular student & education associated city in Turkey that there is so many averaged priced dorms. We always trying to offer you the best dorm as possible in the city center.



TRANSPORTATION IN ISTANBUL

To use all public transport in Istanbul (boats, subways, buses, trams, funiculars) You will need the magnetic card (Istanbul Kart). You find it in the small kiosks near all metro stations, piers, and also bus stations. It costs 6½, you will then add credit as you know. Keep in mind that most trips cost 2,60½ each way. When you leave you can cash it back in and get your 6½ back.

ISTANBUL UNIVERSITY FACULTY OF PHARMACY

stanbul University Faculty of Pharmacy as known as Turkey's the most rooted pharmacy faculty gives both English and Turkish Pharmacy Education. Experienced academic stuff and also on going English license program makes you a comfortable zone for communicating with English skills. On the other hand Istanbul University Faculty of Pharmacy is located in a very central location called FATİH in European side. It is max 30 minutes long for sight-seeing or hang-out locations like Kadıköy, Beşiktaş, Karaköy, Eminönü, Sultanahmet, Selimiye etc. Near the faculty you can easily find bus, metro and tram stop for transportation. We offer you research internship in this both academically qualified and enjoyable area.

Turkish History of Pharmacy Research Museum

Our museum is the first Museum of Turkish History of Pharmacy, which was created by Prof. Dr. Turhan Baytop in 1960.

In 1999, after the earthquake when the buildings of Faculty of Pharmacy were evacuated for restauration, the museum collection was transported to the archive building by Prof. Dr. Afife Mat and protected during this period.

When the restauration of the historical building of Faculty Pharmacy, Keçecizade Fuat Paşa Mansion, was completed two halls next to the Dean's office on the first floor were reserved for the museum and the collection was installed in these halls.

Furniture of two ottoman pharmacies, Pasteur Pharmacy and Istikamet Pharmacy, as well as porcelain drug jars from various pharmacy stores, product bottles, various materials used in the preparation of magistral formulations and prescription registration books provide useful information about the development of pharmacies in our country.

Diplomas from various periods of pharmacy education that began in 1839, diploma registration books, pictures of pharmacy graduates, outdoor signs of the School of Pharmacy, can be found in the collection. A rich collection of pharmaceutical and medical books in Ottoman, Turkish, English, French, German and Italian languages, oldest one being the Pharmacopée Universelle by Nicolas Leméry published in 1734 are also part of museum's collection.

Community pharmacy's working hours and open night days are determined by Chambers of Pharmacists and performed by all over the Turkey's community pharmacies. Working hours are 8:30 am-19:00 pm in weekdays and 9:00 am-19:00 pm on Saturdays. Open night days are determined by number of the community pharmacies in that area. A pharmacy student performs his/her internship only in weekdays and 4-6 hours long per day. Pharmacist's, intern's, technician's communication skills must be well for counseling and helping the patients. Pharmacies that we select for internship are mostly in touristic areas because we want our SEPers connect and communicate with the patients easily.

The Region of Cappodocia is located in the middle of a once-active volcanic area of central Anatolia.

Millions of years ago three of its mountains - Erciyes, Hasandağ and Güllüdağ -were active volcanoes; indeed this activity persisted intermittently at least into the Neolithic period according to the prehistoric paintings.

The volcanic eruptions were so strong that in some places the lava was up to 150m in thickness. Over many millions of years, volcanoes, wind, rain and ice sculpted the region which we now know as Cappadocia.

Cappadocia incorporates the provinces of Aksaray, Nevşehir, Niğde, Kayseri and Kırşehir. For most people, the name Cappadocia suggests the towns of Uçhisar, Göreme, Avanos, Ürgüp, Derinkuyu, Kaymaklı and Ihlara, where the land has been shaped into fantastic forms over the course of millions of years.


