Q: Why should I donate blood right now?

A: Donor centers have experienced a dramatic reduction in donations due to the implementation of social distancing and the cancellation of blood drives. There is no substitute for human blood, so your donation can make a difference in someone's life!








Q: Is it safe to donate blood right now?

A: In light of COVID-19, the Red Cross is currently taking extra measures to protect donors and staff, including having all individuals at blood drives wear face masks. However, if you feel ill, stay home and do not attend your blood donation appointment.



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Q: Can coronavirus be transmitted via a blood transfusion?

A: No, there is currently **no evidence** that coronavirus can be transmitted via blood transfusion

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Q: What can I expect when I donate blood?

A: The actual blood donation usually takes about 10 minutes. The entire process - from the time you sign in to the time you leave - takes about an hour. That's all you need to save lives!

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Q: How many lives can my donation save?

A: Your 1 donation can save up to 3 lives!

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
