WHERE TO GO IN ISTANBUL?



TAKSIM SQUARE

Taksim square, with its location leading to the monument, Gezi park, domed church of Aya Triada, nostalgic tram, Huseyin Aga Mosque and famous Istiklal Street, is the most popular square in Istanbul as well as in Turkey.



Many popular tourist places like restaurants, pubs, bars and cafes, sights, museums are situated along the square.

Within it is a statue of Atatürk, the founder of the Turkish Republic, and it is a symbolic spot

ISTIKLAL AVENUE

Many people have a love/hate relationship with the ever-bustling (Istiklal Street or Istiklal Avenue – İstiklal Caddesi in Turkish) that runs from Taksim Square nearly all the way to the landmark Galata Tower. Although it is the beating heart of the city, the three million people that pass it every day can make it rather challenging to traverse. Yet it serves as a microcosm of Istanbul itself and although chains and fast food joints are starting to edge out the more old-fashioned shops, there's still traces of old Istanbul here.



Aside from the obvious Istiklal Street shopping opportunities, there are many other Istiklal Street attractions. Look out for historic cinemas (like Atlas, Beyoglu), historical passages (like Hazzopulo, Suriye and Çiçek), churches (St Antoine, Santa Maria), consulate buildings, and innovative art galleries (check out SALT Beyoğlu, Mesher and the Mısır Apartments), as well as stunning examples of 19th century Neo-Classical and Art Nouveau architecture to admire.





GALATA TOWER

Considered among the oldest towers in the world and one of the symbols of Istanbul, Galata Tower (Galata Kulesi) was included in the UNESCO World Heritage Temporary List in 2013. Galata Tower, one of the most important structures that make up the silhouette of Istanbul, was used as a long-term fire watchtower. The building is used today as a museum with exhibition areas.



The legend of the Galata Tower says that whomever you climb this historic tower with at the first time, you are destined to marry.

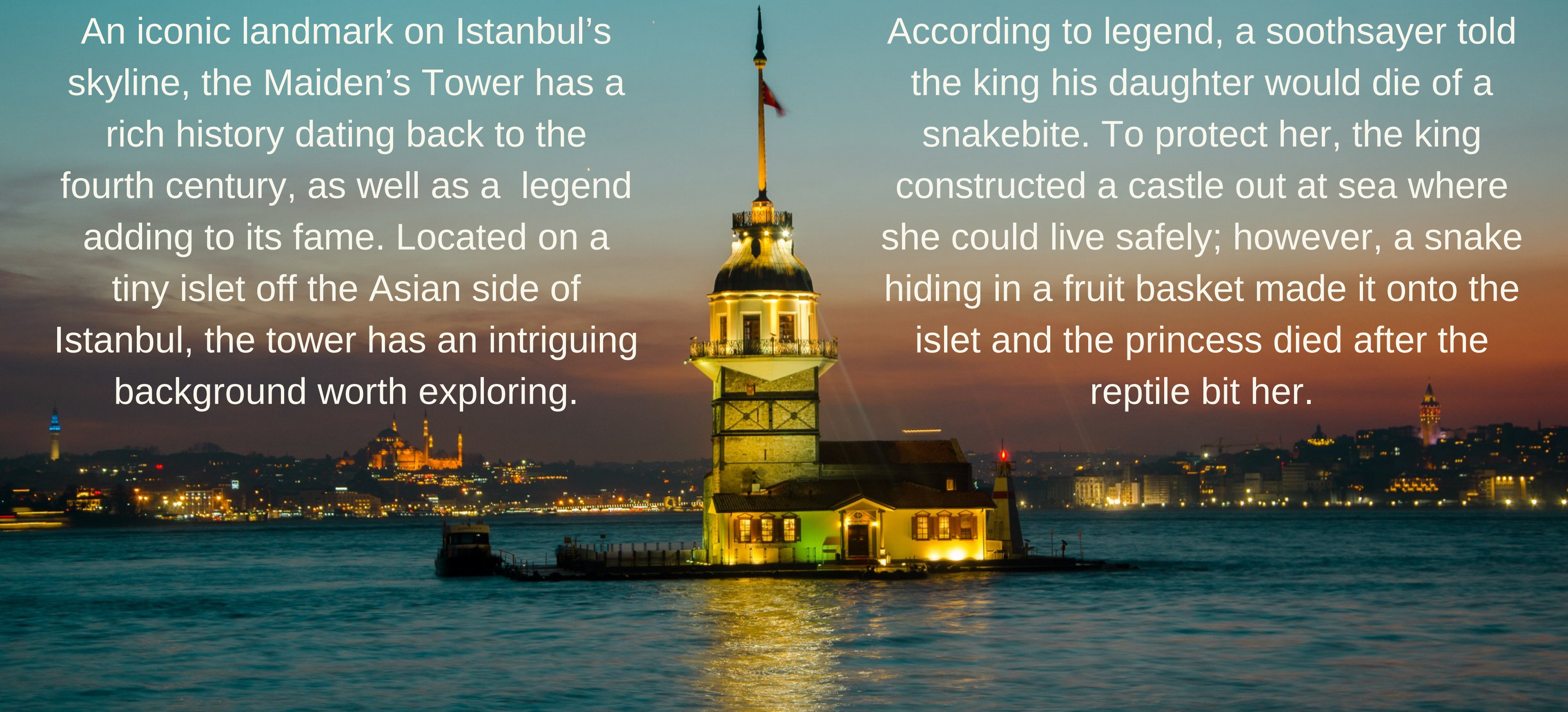

MAIDEN'S TOWER

An iconic landmark on Istanbul's skyline, the Maiden's Tower has a rich history dating back to the fourth century, as well as a legend adding to its fame. Located on a tiny islet off the Asian side of Istanbul, the tower has an intriguing background worth exploring.

According to legend, a soothsayer told the king his daughter would die of a snakebite. To protect her, the king constructed a castle out at sea where she could live safely; however, a snake hiding in a fruit basket made it onto the islet and the princess died after the reptile bit her.



EMINONU

Eminonu is located on the south side of the Golden Horn, by the harbor. There are many balikekmek (basically a fish sandwich) along the coast. Galata Bridge (connects Galata neighborhood and Eminonu) includes a few cafes and restaurants. Eminonu is also a good place for shopping. The historical Egyptian Spice Bazaar is a colorful place with a lot of spice. You can see Galata Tower and New Mosque (Yeni Cami) while walking in the Eminonu Square.





HAGIA SOPHIA

Hagia Sophia (Ayasofya) is one of the oldest places of worship in the world. Built by year 532 and 537. Hagia

Sophia carries the characteristics of Byzantium and Ottoman Empires. It is located in Fatih, the Historical Peninsula of Istanbul.

ORTAKOY MOSQUE

Ortakoy Mosque (Ortaköy Camii) is one of the most beautiful mosques in Istanbul. It is located in the Bosphorus, Besiktas. The Mosque can be viewed from the Bosphorus tour boats.



BLUE MOSQUE

Blue Mosque (Sultanahmet Camii) is a popular mosque located in the Historical Peninsula.



Basilica Cistern



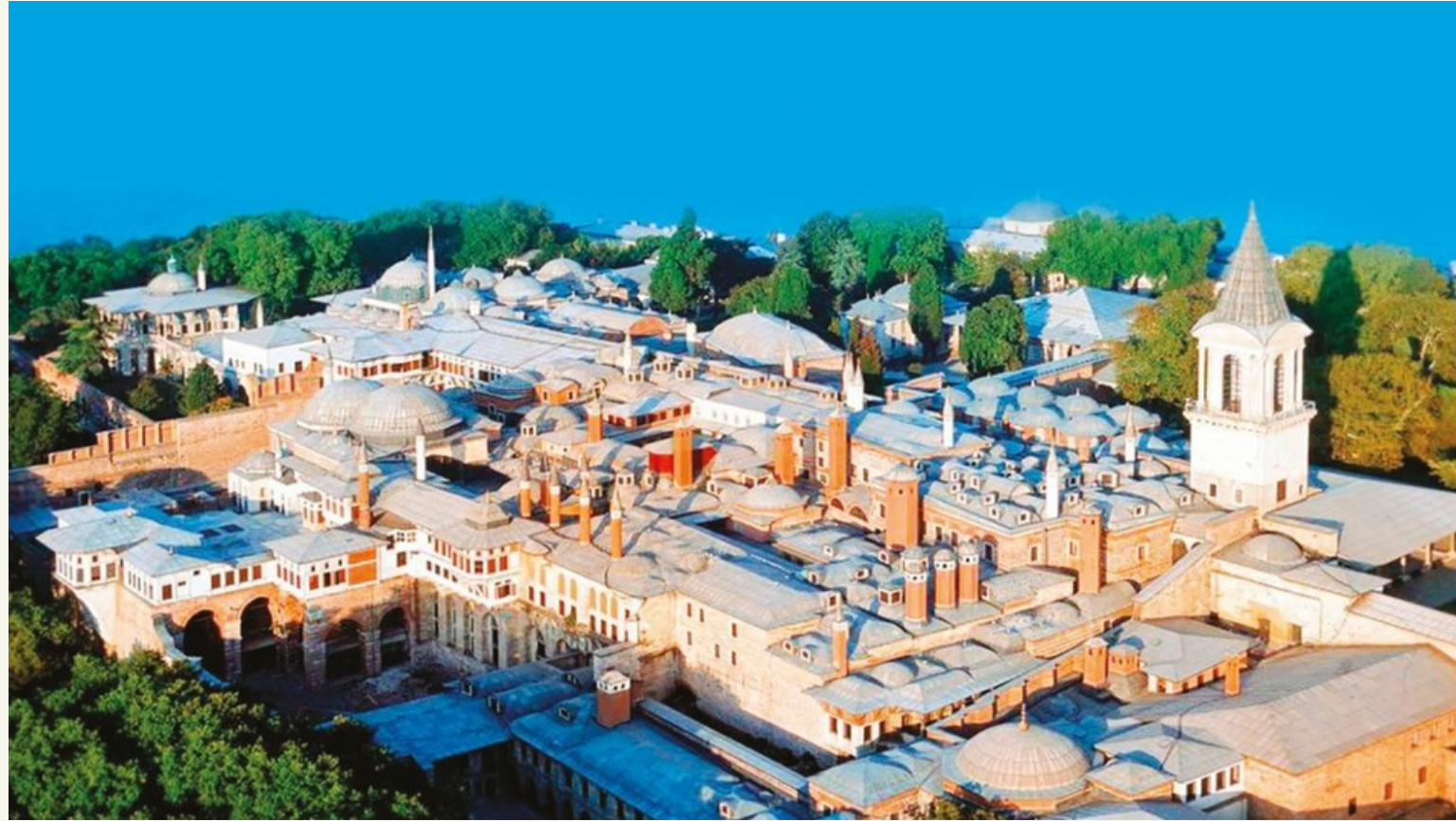
Basilica Cistern was built with the order of Emperor Justinianus I and it was used to meet the water needs of the Great Palace, during Byzantium period. It is serving a museum now, is one of the most impressive and mystical buildings, as well as one of the most visited sights in Istanbul. The cistern is a very quiet and peaceful place conveyed by the columns through impressive arches. The columns, including the legendary Medusa Heads, were compiled from the ancient structures and sculpted of several kinds of marbles.

PRINCES' ISLANDS

Princes' Islands (Adalar) are one of the major tourist attractions in Istanbul. It is a good destination for who needs an escape from metropol. It is a wonder of nature. There are no cars in islands. Main transportation vehicles are bicycles and electric vehicles.



TOPKAPI PALACE



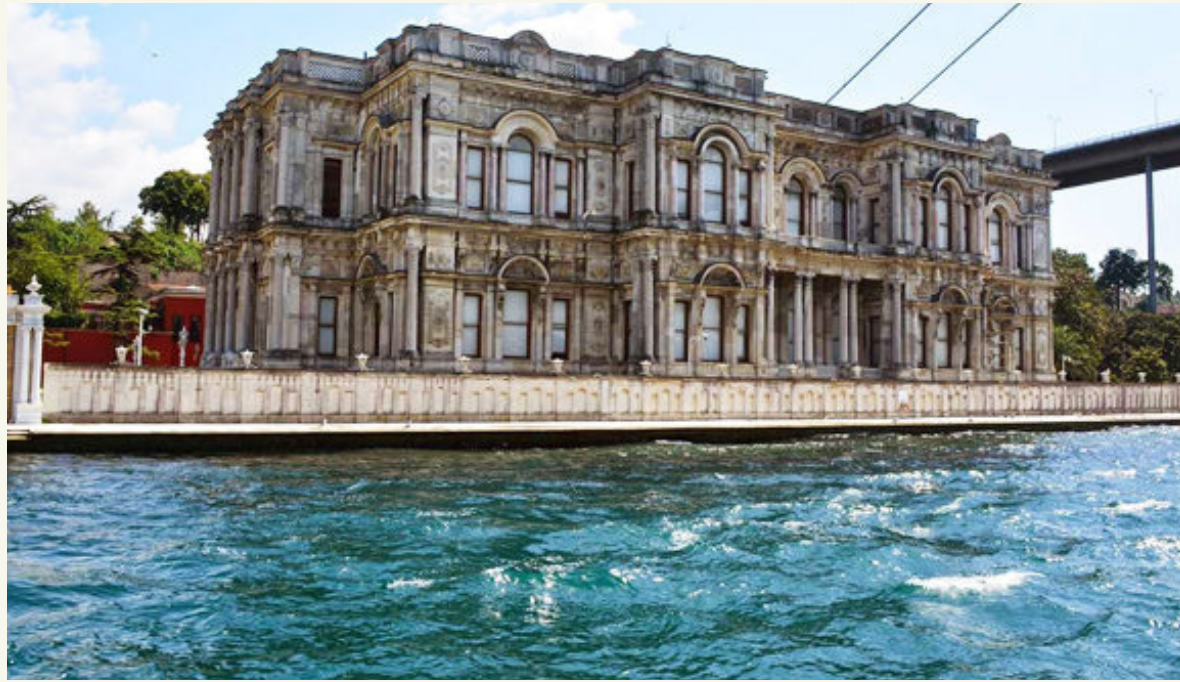
Located on the historical Istanbul peninsula between the Marmara Sea, the Bosphorus and the Golden Horn, the palace is one of the iconic structures of Istanbul. It was the administrative, educational and artistic center of the empire for approximately four hundred years of the 600 years old accumulation of the Ottoman Empire.

DOLMABAHCE PALACE

Dolmabahçe Palace, the elegant palace of the Bosphorus, is one of the most magnificent symbolic structures of the Ottoman Empire's changing 19th century identity.

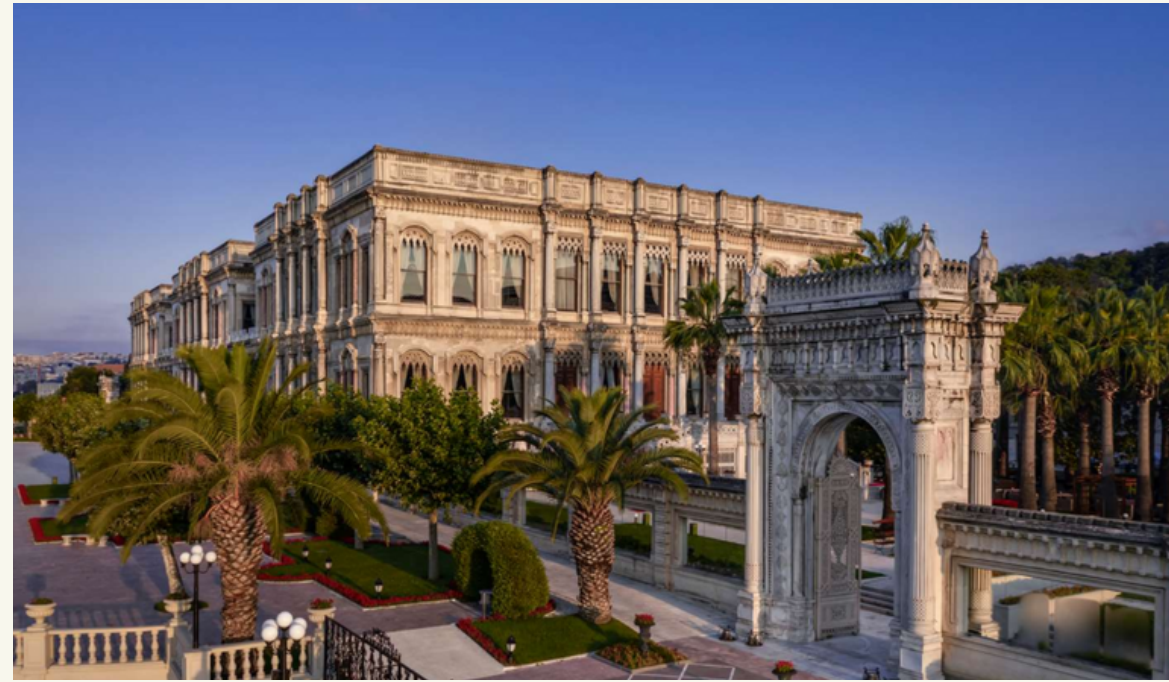


BEYLERBEYI PALACE



A glorious 19th-century monument that impresses with its set gardens and fascinates with its mansions, Beylerbeyi is a unique place where history and historical characters merge with the present.

CIRAGAN PALACE



Çırağan Palace, located on Beşiktaş's Çırağan Street today, is an extension of the Tulip Era, which was hit by entertainment and culture. Today it is used as a hotel.

YILDIZ PALACE



It is a vast complex of former imperial Ottoman pavilions and villas in Istanbul, Turkey, built in the 19th and early 20th centuries. It was used as a residence by the Sultan and his court in the late 19th century.

As known as Turkey's the most rooted pharmacy faculty gives both English and Turkish Pharmacy Education. It is located in a very central location called Fatih in European side. On the other hand, you can arrive to sight-seeing or hang-out locations really fast.



Turkish History of Pharmacy Research Museum



Our museum is the first Museum of Turkish History of Pharmacy, was created by Prof. Dr. Turhan Baytop in 1960.

Furniture of two ottoman pharmacies, Pasteur Pharmacy and Istikamet Pharmacy, as well as porcelain drug jars from various pharmacy stores, product bottles, various materials used in the preparation of magistral formulations and prescription registration books provide useful information about the development of pharmacies in our country. Diplomas from various periods of pharmacy education that began in 1839, diploma registration books, pictures of pharmacy graduates, outdoor signs of the School of Pharmacy, can be found in the collection. A rich collection of pharmaceutical and medical books in Ottoman, Turkish, English, French, German and Italian languages, oldest one being the Pharmacopée Universelle by Nicolas Leméry published in 1734 are also part of museum's collection.

GRAND BAZAAR

one of the world's oldest and biggest malls

Once inside, the 64 streets and smaller lanes are home to around 4,000 shops, as well as the bazaar's own mosque, post office, restaurants, banks, and police station, making it a central city in miniature.



A visit here is not simply about shopping for souvenirs. With its grand arcaded main streets and narrow alleys leading between hans (old trader inns) and bedestens (market halls), it is one of the best places to visit in Istanbul to get a sense of Ottoman life.
